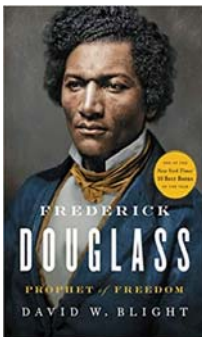
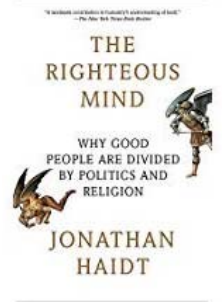

Dear Friends,

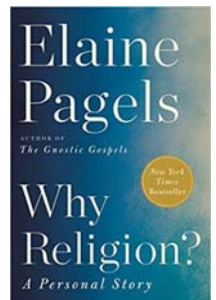
What have you been reading? I typically set for myself an annual goal to read 30 books. Some of those will be books of a religious persuasion—things that might find their way into my preaching and teaching, or into discussions with church leaders about how to best be the church together. I must confess, I almost never make my reading goal, but I sure gain a lot by trying. With the weather such as it is, there is no better time of year to get a jump on your 2019 reading list. Here are a few books that have expanded my mind, challenged me, and delighted me in recent months.

I was turned on to “The Righteous Mind,” by Jonathan Haidt, at the Senior Minister Leadership conference I attended in January. The premise of the book is that as our minds begin to form in the womb, naturally occurring attributes incline us to patterns of thought that predispose us toward a particular place on the political spectrum. That is not to say our thinking is predetermined, but that we are born with brains wired in something akin to a first draft, which can be changed by our experiences. Haidt encourages us to think of our rational minds and our intuitions as if they were a person riding an elephant. The rational mind is like the person, who might be able to urge the elephant in a certain direction, but ultimately the elephant (our intuition) will go where it wants. He delves deep into the values and intuitions that shape human thought on politics and religion. If you want to gain a better understanding of why people radically different from you think the way they do (a noble and timely goal if ever there was one!) then I suggest you give this book a read.



Next up, a new biography on Frederick Douglass by David Blight. I remember learning about Douglass in grade school history classes, but hadn’t thought or heard much about him since then. His life story is remarkable, compelling, and tragic all at once. Born into slavery on Maryland’s eastern shore, Douglass escaped and went on to become one of the greatest orators, abolitionists, and agents of positive change in American history. It paints a picture of a man whose accomplishments are hard to quantify, yet was also, in Blight’s words, “thoroughly and beautifully human.” I’m not big on biographies, but this one truly is a page-turner. It speaks not only to the challenges of Douglass’s time, but to the challenges our society continues to face today, with hope.

Last but not least, “Why Religion?” by Elaine Pagels. Pagels is a renowned scholar of New Testament and early Christian literature who currently teaches at Princeton University. “Why Religion?” is not a scholarly work, but a memoir. Pagels recounts the story of her own life, describing how her faith journey was shaped by the untimely deaths of her husband and her six-year-old son, only a year apart. Pagels evidences a depth of wisdom and emotional intelligence that rival her lofty academic credentials. I would recommend this read to anyone, but especially to those who are coping with the loss of a loved one. Pagels sat for an interview with Terry Gross on NPR’s Fresh Air last November. Search “Why Religion? Asks How Hearts Can Heal After Tragedy” to read or listen to the interview.



That’s what I’ve been reading. Let me know what you’ve been reading. I’m always interested to hear what you’re into.

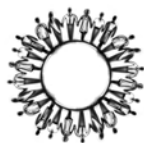
"Resurrection, Immortality, and Life After Death: What do you Believe?" Led by Rev. Fred Harris

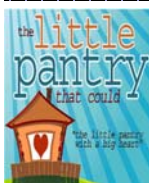
